Looking Ahead Editorial By Roger Hipple, CWC

As we enter the new year, I would like to take this opportunity to give some insight as to where I see the Big Red One Living History Organization going.

Plans for revisions to the Unit's Constitution:

The Constitution and By-Laws are in need of some changes, many of which were discussed at the Emergency Winter Meeting 2008.

You have all heard the saying that a camel was a horse designed by a committee and the famous work place quote, meetings are a way to avoid work. Well we will have to have a committee that will work together and get it done. Therefore, I would like to propose a method of putting ideas before the membership for discussion so that the committee appointed to the task has a general idea of where the unit membership wishes to go regarding changes to the way the unit is conducted.

Between the first of the year and the June Meeting, if a member have a suggestion on how something should be changed, just e-mail it to me, and I will use the unit's bulk e-mail list to see that everyone gets a copy of it. That way everyone is in the loop and knows what to possibly expect. I plan on forwarding only suggestions, not holding a open forum to debate what should and should not be done. That will be the job of the committee. What I am proposing would be helpful to the committee in letting them get input from all the members before they start rewriting and making changes. It will avoid starting from scratch, we keep the good parts and change what needs to be changed, so when the membership finally votes on the changes to the constitution, it can be adopted in a very orderly manner.

Let me start the process by submitting the proposed change to the leadership I spoke about at the last meeting.

In addition to the four Board Members, there would be the addition of three Directors (Trustees). Each one would serve a six year term, with a new Director being elected every two years. Sort of like the way the House and Senate work, with Representatives being elected for two year terms, and Senators being elected to six year terms. To get this started we would elect three Directors, one for a two year term, one for a four year term and one for a six year term, and then when they come up for reelection the rotation would already be established. The purpose of the Directors would be to replace all standing committees, elections, promotion, demotion, by-laws, authenticity standards, and standard operation procedures, recruitment and retention. The Directors would report to the Board of Officers and be responsible for the long lasting stability required as the unit gets bigger. To be eligible to be elected Director, a person would have to be willing to make a six year commitment to the unit, have a good working knowledge of the unit, and have been a member for a minimum of five years. I could name several members who would fit these requirements.

We also, must address, Board of Officer vacancies, due to resigning or death, so to avoid some of the issues of having a diminished Board of Officers. I would propose that the President appoint a member to the Board of the Directors in the event of a vacancy. With the Vice-President, becoming the President in the event of the President's resignation or death. The Secretary and Treasurer would retain their positions, but would be eligible to assume other positions on the Board at the request of the President, who would then appoint a member to fill the vacated position.
